Canines with a Cause Program Information

Mission: The mission of Canines With a Cause is to create a sustainable programs and processes to effectively and holistically treat combat veterans with PTSD with well-trained, specialized service dogs that provide emotional therapy as companions. By rescuing dogs from kill shelters and using prison inmates as a means to train, we essentially save three lives: the veteran, the dog, and the inmate.

Primary Programs/Projects:

Pawsitive Partnerships: The Pawsitive Partnerships program places dogs that we've evaluated and rescued from a shelter with a veteran who immediately starts working with us to train the dog for their specific needs.

Comfort Crew: With our help, veterans can train their dogs to be therapy animals and take them to places to help give other veterans comfort—such as VA hospitals and assisted living programs for veterans.

Diamonds In The Ruff: If a dog that we've rescued doesn't work in our Pawsitive Healing or Partnership program, we adopt them out to the public.

Pawsitive Healing Prison Program: In this program, we partner with the Utah State Prison Women's Correctional Facility. After the female inmates go through training with our staff, our dogs move into the prison and are trained to be service dogs by the female inmates. Once the dogs have completed their training, they are placed with a veteran.

Adopt-A-Native-Elder Program (ANE)

Program Information

Mission: ANE exists to create a bridge of hope between Native Americans and their cultures. It allows us to reach out to one another, share our gifts, and mend the broken circle of our relationship and the Land and the Native Americans who hold it in sacred trust.

Programs/Projects: ANE provides food, firewood, supplies and economic opportunity to Navajo Elders living in remote areas at or below poverty on the Arizona and Utah Reservation, so they can remain in

their homes as they age, with basic comfort and security. People can ‘adopt’ and Elder by purchasing items for a specific Elder through ANE. ANE volunteers work year round to collect, sort, and pack supplies. Volunteers take supplies to the reservation, donating their time, vehicles and expenses. ANE provides quality wool to Elder weavers who can no longer herd sheep, and helps them get full value for Navajo rugs through an on line catalogue and rug shows. When rugs are sold, all the money is given to the weaver. At the Annual November Park City Rug Show, Elders demonstrate their art and culture for school children and the community. This is a premiere show of Navajo art and culture.

As the program grew, counselors began to refer students who simply didn’t “fit in” because of challenges such as ADHD, Autism, Asperger’s and other challenges making it difficult for them to thrive.

The Board of Trustees is very involved and contributes financially and in talent to the organization. There is currently one full-time staff, Executive Director/ Program Director, a part-time paid consultant (Founder) and 26 facilitators and artists paid as independent contractors.
