



The Women's Giving Fund will improve outcomes for at-risk women and children, by doubling the capacity in Park City to provide developmental support to 0-3 year old children and their mothers.

What is "PAT"?

Parents as Teachers™ (PAT) is a home-visiting program, with individualized activities, that promotes the optimal early development, learning and health of young children by supporting and engaging their parents.

What is the impact for the Park City community?

Holy Cross Ministries (HCM) is currently the **only** PAT affiliated organization in Summit County, and we have reached capacity. The Women's Giving Fund Grant will provide the necessary resources for HCM to add a second PAT staff member, and increase the number of women and children served from 35 to 70 - which will impact the community, at large. Evaluation results from 12+ outcome studies on the PAT model include the following long-term impacts for communities where PAT programs exist:

- Children's developmental delays and health problems are detected early
- Children enter kindergarten ready to learn and the achievement gap is narrowed
- Children achieve school success into the elementary grades
- Parents improve their parenting knowledge and skills
- Parents are more involved in their children's schooling
- Families are more likely to promote children's language and literacy

Why does this matter?

There is a growing waitlist of women who have asked to enroll in HCM's program, and organizations like Peace House, PC Tots, and the People's Health Clinic have asked to refer families as well. Without increased funding, these families will continue to go without support. This matters for women like Robyn*, a single mom enrolled in HCM's pilot PAT program who explained; *"I want the best for my daughter, and this program is teaching me how to make that possible. Being able to help her grow and learn means the world to me."* There are so many moms like Robyn who want the tools to help *their* children on a pathway to success and healthy development.

Tracking Success

HCM will use the following tools to measure and evaluate the success of the program:

- The ASQ-3® and ASQ:SE-2® (developmental screening tools for children ages 0-3)
- *The Life Skills Progression™* (a field-tested data tool which helps to monitor the mom's progress)

Sustainability beyond the Women's Giving Fund Grant

The success that is tracked and measured in during the Women's Giving Fund grant period will be used in future proposals to illustrate program effectiveness and solicit additional funding from other sources to sustain the impact.
