TreeUtah's mission is to improve Utah's quality of life for present and future generations by enhancing the environment through tree planting, stewardship, and education. Planting trees renew our air supply; lower air temperatures; and improve water quality by slowing and filtering rainwater.

 Approximately 200 indigenous, climateresilient trees have been distributed and planted (1 Sapling = 24 lbs of CO2 per year)

Climate impact: About 2.177 metric tons of CO2 have been sequestered to date

3 Springs Land and Livestock is committed to working with nature to produce healthy soil, healthy meat, and a healthy community. By following the six principles of soil health, they believe that their practices will yield both ecological & economic viability.

Regenerative agriculture practices and measurement



Progress update:

- Began grazing on three ranches on April 1, 2022
- Baseline soil samples collected in April, 2022
- Will host an educational field day for ranchers/ farmers on June 18

Climate Impact: Will continue to follow regenerative agricultural practices and continue to monitor soil levels over the next three years with the goal of sequestering carbon and working towards ecological regeneration





2021 CLIMATE FUND GRANTEE | EATS PARK CITY

EATS Park City has become both an advocate and resource for improving the health and well-being of children and their families in greater Park City community, including eastern Summit County. Their advocacy work at the Park City School District has had a huge impact on local waste diversion.

Elementary school lunch compost programs



Progress update:

- Provided 153 staffed lunches at Jeremy Elementary and Parley's Park Elementary
- Since Aug 21, 2021, collected 20,160 lbs. of food waste

Climate Impact: About 4.63 metric tons of CO2 have been diverted so far
